A noisy fight determines who is the strongest among our species.

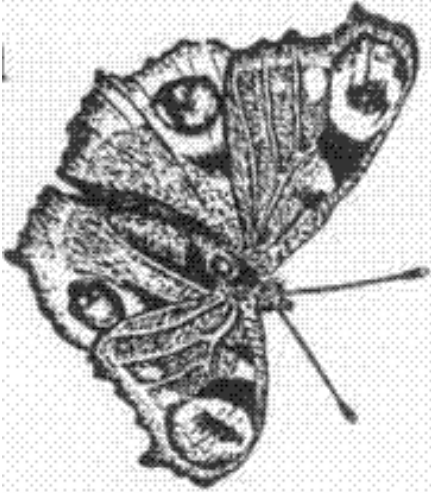
Because of this my kids can follow me, even during the night!

When I am afraid, my hair stands straight up. It makes me look bigger than I am!

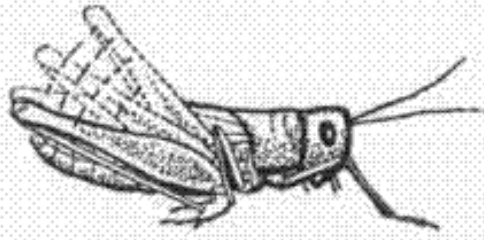
I mark my territory with scent: I want to stop at every tree and lamp post!

When I look for insects, I use sound waves to find my prey.

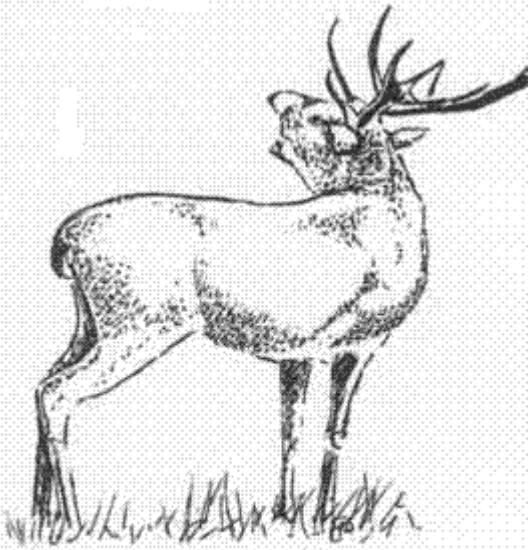
I use my tail to wave scent to females. All under water!



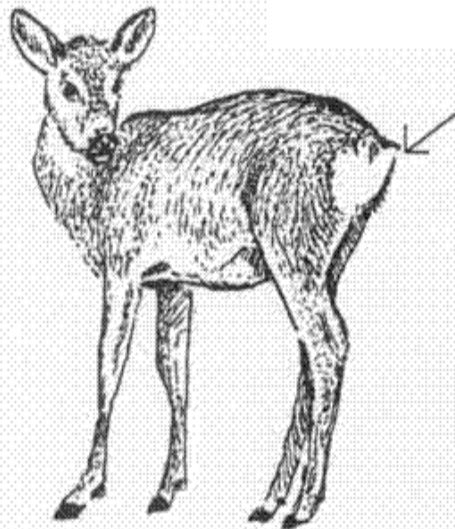

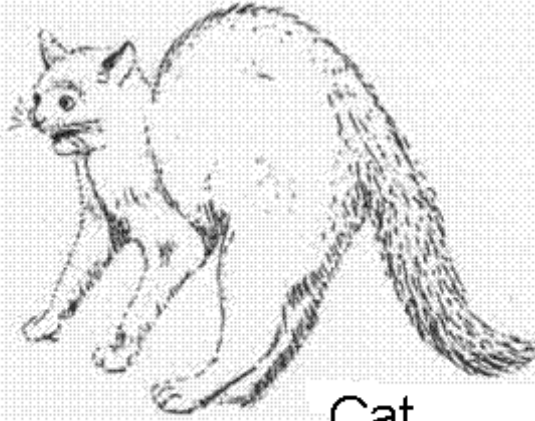
Grass hopper



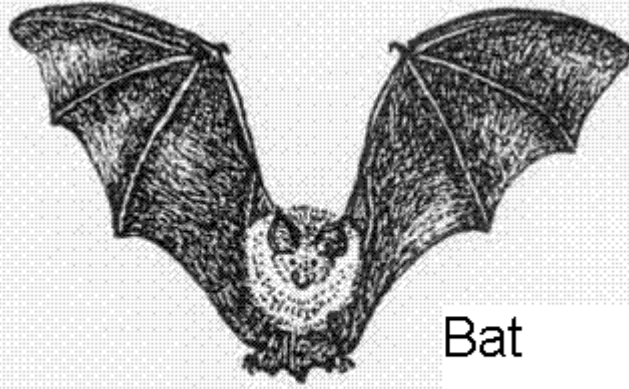

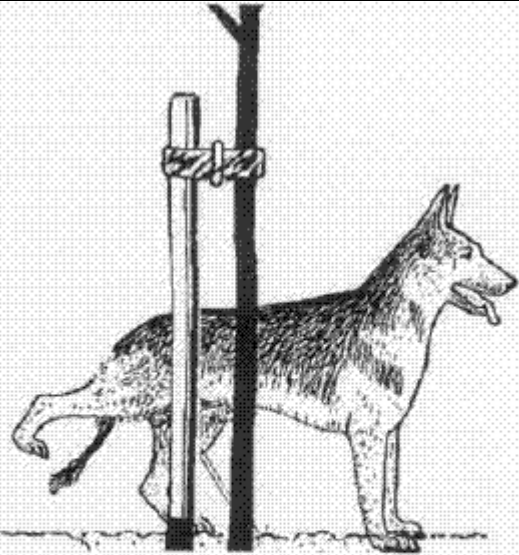

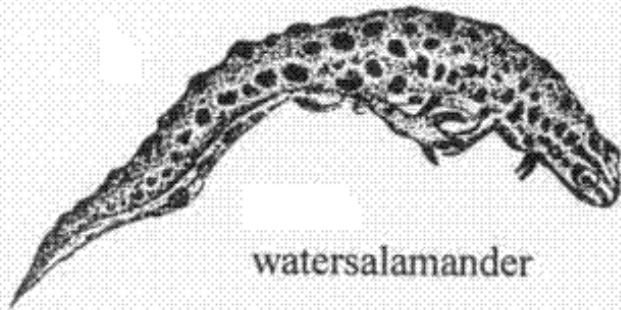
